Greetings, beloveds of Arnolia.

I cannot believe it's already been about two months since I've been around this beloved community. You all are such a loving and welcoming community, and it shows. This is a season of new beginnings. Schools are starting back up, family rhythms of summer vacations are over, and many of our ministries are returning from summer break. I'm looking forward to restarting our weekly Pastor's Study (September 17th), attending my first Fall Flea market (September 21st), and other events to celebrate the Fall.

Additionally, we will follow the Narrative Lectionary for our worship starting September 8th. The Narrative Lectionary walks us through the whole story of the bible from the beginning (in September) to Pentecost (June 2025). I hope that we take a whole year leaning into the full story of the Biblical texts so that we can see how the story connects across the Old and New Testaments and also with our lives. Be on the lookout in the weekly emails throughout the year for daily scripture readings to continue the story at home.

When we start the Pastor's Study back up, we will pick up where the group left off while reading This Here Flesh by Cole Author Riley. If you want to join us for the first time, you are more than welcome to do so. There is no homework required, so any time is a great time to join. Tuesdays at Noon at the church and a link will be published for those who want to join virtually in the upcoming newsletters and bulletins. On Monday evenings in October, I will offer some discussion sessions to process the large events from last Spring's General Conference. There's a significant amount of misinformation online about what happened, so this is a great time to gather and discuss what actually happened and what to expect in the future. The weekly email and bulletins will have the meeting link and dial-in information for those who want to join virtually.

Report from SPRC September – October 2024 Grapevine Craig Nickerson, Chairperson

SPRC has welcomed our new Pastor, Rev. Yost, and are working through the process of helping our new Pastor learn about us, and vice versa. To help with this effort, we have entered into a covenant with Rev. Yost to establish a baseline for mutual evaluation, accountability, and exploration between Rev. Yost and SPRC. We'd like to share it with the congregation for your information.

- 1. The church's main goals for ministry/disciple-making in this next year:
 - a. Purpose: Gather as followers of Jesus Christ; Grow as disciples; Give of ourselves; and Go into the world in service.
 - b. Gather: Continue to engage in passionate worship. Begin a new set of Pastor-led education classes for the congregation.
 - c. Grow: Hold a confirmation class for our youth.
 - d. Give: More fully recognize the spiritual gifts and talents of the congregation.
 - e. Go: Continue our support beyond the walls of Arnolia, begin a new ministry with the Helping Up Mission, and strengthen our relationship with Oakleigh Elementary School.
- 2. The pastor's goals for growth in the practice of ministry/disciple-making
 - a. Successfully complete year one of the Doctor of Ministry program.
 - b. Design and lead a confirmation class for our youth.
- 3. The pastor's goals for personal spiritual growth
 - a. Attend 2 to 3 retreats for spiritual renewal.
- 4. The committee's goals for growth in its ministry as SPRC
 - a. Work together and listen to feedback from the congregation to ensure acceptance of our new Pastor.
- 5. The committee's goals for its spiritual growth
 - a. Members of SPRC will engage in intentional prayer for the congregation and the Pastor.
- 6. In the coming year, we (SPRC and pastor) will work to strengthen our covenant relationship by
 - a. Being in relationship with each other and meeting together on a more frequent basis.
 - b. Establish and promote open lines of communication.
- 7. One way we plan to learn together is
 - a. Participate in the worship and mission life of the congregation.
- 8. During the year, we will assess our progress toward our goals by
 - a. Discussing in each SPRC gathering and assessing our progress.
