Greetings beloved people of Arnolia,

Winter is easing up on us and spring is coming soon. I've been enjoying our journey through the Narrative lectionary since September. And I was so excited to see how many people loved our Advent series from A Sanctified Art. So, when October rolled around, and they announced that their Lenten series would mostly follow the Narrative lectionary, I was excited. And then, I saw the title for the series: *Everything In Between: Meeting God in the midst of extremes*. Back in October that theme resonated with me.

Since then, the USA political climate has dramatically changed. And somehow this theme feels like it was perfectly timed. Even just the overview from our upcoming Lenten series keeps speaking to me today. Below is one reflection on theme:

"In a world that feels polarized in just about every possible way, I find it difficult to discern my voice, and even more so at times, to align with God's voice in the midst of it all. Countless media outlets vie for allegiance, using shock and outrage to try and force people to pick a side or develop a stark all-or-nothing worldview. It's exhausting. The more I try to engage with this binary thinking, the more it all just kind of folds in on itself and falls apart. I long for a faith with nuance that honors the multiplicity and complexity that I experience in my life. I believe that God is in fact not contained by our categories or influenced by our dividers and walls. What would it look like to loosen our grip on our preconceived ideas, and approach our search for God with a

'beginner's mind'? What would it look like to learn from one another and to grow through mutual understanding without compromising what matters most? As we journey this Lent, from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday and everything in between, I hope we closely encounter God, get in tune with ourselves, and experience deeper connection with one another. Perhaps, we'll be surprised by where we find God, and also where we find ourselves."

The food sales have expenses that need to be deducted to arrive at our profit. As we all know, prices for food have risen, which have cut into the amount we make from our food sales. This was evident with the Fall Flea Market.

Some of you remember years ago when Arnolia had Spaghetti Dinners. Members of the congregation contributed what we needed, ground beef, spaghetti, tomatoes, bread and butter etc. I am asking for your help, so that we are able to contribute more from food sales to our General Fund.

I usually buy most items from BJ's to get the best price, and Aldi's for hot dog and hamburger rolls.

EVERSTAND (formerly Board of Child Care) provides housing and support for youth in Maryland, DC, West Virginia and Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania. Mike and Paula Pfeifer reported that the Jacksonville Senior Center members have an ongoing knitting group which has provided hand knitted hats and other knitted items to Everstand. **Paula Pfeifer, Contact Person**

UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief and General Board of Global Ministries) During the year we have supported UMCOR by sending checks to both Global Ministries to help cover administrative costs and the Disaster Relief for the Turkey/Syria earthquake victims. Currently we are collecting cleaning supplies for emergency response buckets. We have several buckets ready to be delivered to May Chapel and several partially filled buckets yet to complete.

Where We Stand

WHERE WE STAND FROM A FINANCIAL PERSPECTIVE Craig Nickerson, Leadership Team Chair

Arnolia has been richly blessed. We have a strong core of volunteers willing to work together to advance our mission. The congregation is providing good financial support, and our leadership team works well together.

We finished calendar year 2024 with a small surplus of income over expenses. However, there were several significant changes in 2024 leading to this surplus. First, we have new Pastor at a substantially lower salary than our previous Pastor. Second, we are only paying the new Director of Music / Organist half of what we were paying the previous one (and didn't pay one at all for 8 months in 2024). Third, we only paid 90% of our Mission Shares (conference obligations) in 2024. Finally, our Thrift Store is realizing significant income from sales (\$36,000 in 2024). Together, these helped us finish the year on the positive side.

The New Year has begun a little differently. Just like everyone else, our BGE bills have significantly increased (the January 2025 bill was higher than any previous bill we've received), and the weather so far this winter is requiring us to spend money on snow removal. Our expenses are higher than our income, and any "extra" money left at the end of 2024 is quickly being spent. Continuing to meet our financial obligations and 100% of our Mission Shares (conference obligations) will require continued strong financial support from our members.

As a congregation, we're asking for three things from you in 2025.

First, please continue to keep Arnolia and its leadership in your prayers. We cannot overemphasize the power of prayer to transform our lives and provide guidance for the future.

Second, please step up and volunteer in support of our activities. The Spring Flea Market is fast approaching. The Thrift Store is open every Thursday and can always use volunteers, and we continue to be involved in many mission activities. Arnolia can only continue making a difference in this world if we all work together and volunteer our time.

Finally, please continue providing financial support to Arnolia ensuring our ability to pay our bills, support our ministries, and continue supporting the mission activities of the congregation.

We are confident Arnolia will meet our commitments, continue to minister to the people of the community, and work to advance God's Kingdom in this world. We need your prayers, your time, and your financial support to make it happen.

Implementing Vital Change in the Baltimore-Washington Conference A Report from the Arnolia Leadership Team

In the face of declining church membership, declining attendance, and declining religious participation, the people of the Baltimore-Washington Conference decided to focus on moving closer to Christ, to focus on transformational, outward-facing, community-driven ministry, and to do so in a collaborative manner consistent with our shared values. Vital Change involves refocusing on being the hands and feet of Christ in the community, reconnecting to our values, and restructuring to support our goal of 100% of our churches being 100% vital.

In support of this Vital Change, the following structural changes are being made in the Baltimore-Washington Conference:

- 1. all churches will be part of a collaborative hub,
- 2. all hubs will be part of geographic districts, and
- 3. non-mission-related, specialized administrative duties will be centralized to support churches, rather than requiring each district to provide these services.

For Arnolia, this means we will be placed into a collaborative hub with 5-12 other churches within the same geographic region. The primary purpose of a collaborative hub is to support the creation, improvement, and growth of transformational, disciple-making, outward-facing, community-driven mission. Each collaborative hub will use missional action planning, or MAP, a process of discovery, ideation, experimentation, and evolution to create and implement a missional action plan for the hub. Collaborative hub plans should help identify centers of expertise and reflect shared priorities and how people will support each other. Even as churches are connected in hubs, each church maintains its existing administrative structure (e.g., unified board, board of trustees, finance, SPRC, etc.) that makes decisions and provides leadership to each church. Each collaborative hub determines the details of how they connect and what their collaborative ministry looks like.

We are expecting the collaborative hubs to be announced after Easter. We prayerfully believe only positive impacts will come from this change, allowing Arnolia to strengthen our mission work in the community.
